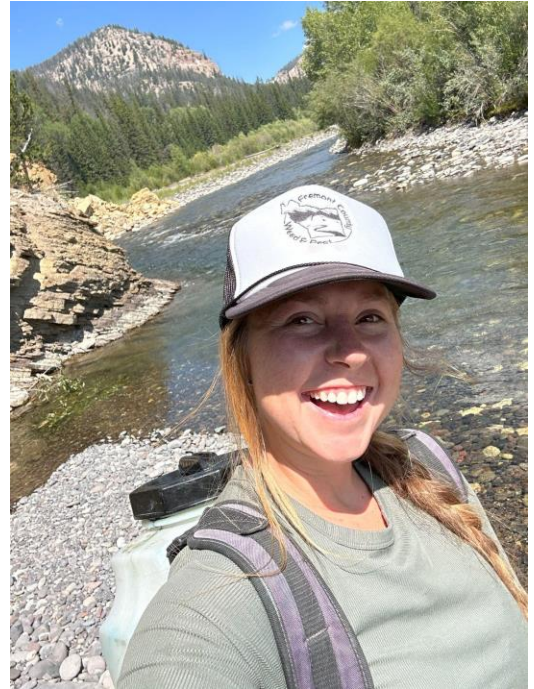


Olivia Maxwell

Today, Olivia works to protect our public lands by leading the Early Detection Rapid Response (EDRR) backpack crew. They treat isolated small noxious weed infestations before they spread into larger infestations, causing economic and ecological problems.

We'll explore how to identify noxious weeds and how to locate them with handheld GPS units. The growing season in Wyoming is short, so get ready to locate infestations fast!
